

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Flower and Produce Show is open to exhibitors who are resident, work in, or are otherwise involved within the Parish of Wistaston. Members of Wistaston Gardeners Society, Wistaston and District Flower Club, Wistaston Swans WI, Wistaston U3A Groups, Domestic Science students at South Cheshire College and plot holders at Wistaston or Willaston Allotments may also enter the show.
2. Entries to be made on the form provided and must reach the Show Secretary no later than **Friday 9th August 2024**. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
Entry EXHIBITS for Photographic Classes to be with the Show President by **Friday 9th August as judging for the Parish Council photography competition takes place before the show date.**
3. On the Saturday of the show, the hall will open at **8:30 AM** and remain open for staging exhibits until **11:00 AM** when it will be closed for judging.
4. All exhibits must be owned and have been grown or made by the exhibitors (with the exception of those in Section A, Flower Arrangements)
5. No person other than an amateur may compete, stage, or assist in staging of an exhibit. For the purpose of this rule, an amateur is a person who does not sell or grow plants, flowers, vegetables or fruits as a means of livelihood.
6. The EXHIBITORS must provide all vases, stands, slates, boards, etc.
7. All exhibits must be staged according to the direction of the Show President and must not exceed the space allotted.
8. Numbers corresponding with the entries will be given by the Show President to exhibitors who will be responsible for placing their number on each exhibit. Anyone not doing so may have the exhibit disqualified.
9. Any exhibit not corresponding with the Schedule's description will be carded N.A.S. (Not As Schedule).
10. The judges have the authority to withhold, or recommend additional prizes at their discretion. **A JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
11. Exhibitors are invited to indicate on the Entry Form which, if any, of their exhibits may be auctioned at the end of the show.
12. Following the trophy presentations, exhibitors must immediately remove any exhibits not due to be auctioned so preventing these items from going under the hammer.
13. Prize monies (Photography and Childrens' classes) will be paid during the afternoon and must be collected on the day.
14. Any complaints by exhibitors must be in writing and handed to the Show President before 3 PM on the day of the show.
15. The Show President will take every possible care but will NOT be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur to exhibitors' property during the show.
16. All Challenge Cups and Trophies must be polished and returned to the Show President **14 DAYS BEFORE THE DATE OF THE NEXT SHOW.**
17. A **BOWL** is a vessel having a diameter at its mouth at least equal to its height.
A **VASE** has a height greater than the diameter of its mouth.
18. Entries for classes in the HOBBYCRAFT Section must NOT have been entered in previous years.
19. **VICTORIA SANDWICH CAKE RECIPE** - 100g Self-Raising Flour, 100g Caster Sugar, 100g Margarine/Butter, 2 Eggs, 1 dessertspoonful of warm water. The whole mixture to be divided between and baked in two 18cm approx. straight sandwich tins. Fill with jam only, no sugar coating. The whole cake to weigh 500g approx. with jam.
20. **FLORAL ART ARRANGEMENT** - The exhibits to be assembled **AT HOME**. **ONLY ONE EXHIBIT PER CLASS** but **EACH OF THE CLASSES** may be entered. To be judged under National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies (N.A.F.A.S.) rules.
21. **CLASS V4** exhibits to be shown on **SHALLOW COLLARS**. **No drapes allowed.**
22. All rules must be strictly adhered to or disqualification may result.

SECTION F: FLOWER CLASSES

- F1. Bowl of Sweet Peas, mixed colours, 15 stems minimum
- F2. A specimen Rose in a vase
- F3. Three Large Gladioli, any variety or varieties
- F4. Three Pom Pom Dahlias, any variety or varieties
- F5. Three Cactus or Semi Cactus Dahlias, any variety or varieties
- F6. Three Decorative Dahlias, any variety of varieties
- F7. A Single Stem of any Flowering Plant (not in schedule) in a Vase
- F8. A Single Geranium Head in a Vase
- F9. Six French Marigolds, any variety of varieties
- F10. A Shallow Bowl of Floating Flower Heads, arranged for effect
- F11. A Vase of Mixed Flowers, home grown
- F12. A Cactus or Succulent
- F13. A Geranium in a Pot (with a saucer)
- F14. A Begonia in a Pot (with a saucer)
- F15. Flowering Plant in a Pot (with a saucer) excluding plants from Classes F13/14/17/18
- F16. A Foliage Plant in a Pot (with a saucer)
- F17. Six Fuchsia Heads on a board
- F18. A Fuchsia in a Pot (up to 15cm, with a saucer), any variety
- F19. Alpine Garden 25cm x 25cm maximum

SECTION V: VEGETABLE CLASSES

- V1. A Vegetable not on schedule (please specify on entry form)
- V2. Five White Potatoes on a Plate, any variety
- V3. Five Coloured Potatoes on a Plate, any variety
- V4. Three Onions – roots shown, not to exceed 225 grams each (see rule 21)
- V5. Six Carrots – tops trimmed to 8cm
- V6. Nine Shallots – Large (over 30mm in diameter)
- V7. Three Round Beetroot – tops trimmed to 8cm
- V8. One Vegetable Marrow – with stalk
- V9. One Lettuce – roots shown
- V10. One Cucumber – with stalk
- V11. Five Ripe Tomatoes (not cherry variety) on a plate
- V12. A Truss of Tomatoes (not cherry variety) – some ripe
- V13. A Truss of a Named Variety of Cherry Tomatoes on a plate – some ripe
- V14. Five Ripe Cherry Tomatoes on a plate – variety to be named
- V15. Six Runner Beans – all with some stalk
- V16. Six French Beans – all with some stalk
- V17. Three Courgettes – each with some stalk
- V18. A Single Pot of Three Different Herbs

SECTION D: WISTASTON PARISH COUNCIL VEGETABLE DISPLAY

- D1. A Collection of Five Different Classes of Vegetables

SECTION B: HARVEST BASKET

- B1. A Basket containing Fruit, Flowers & Produce – not to exceed 46cm in width and length; height unrestricted

SECTION A: FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS (Please read rule 20)

- A1. Arrangement in a tall vase
- A2. Small arrangement in a cup and saucer

SECTION H: HOUSECRAFT CLASSES (Please cover entries with transparent covering)

- H1. A Jar of Home Made Strawberry Jam - cellophane covers only
- H2. A jar of Home Made Jam – NOT Strawberry – cellophane covers only
- H3. A Jar of Home Made Chutney - cellophane covers only
- H4. Three Pieces of Shortbread
- H5. Five Square Flapjacks
- H6. Five Jam Tarts
- H7. A Plate of Five Chocolate Butterfly Cakes
- H8. A Lemon Drizzle Cake baked in a loaf tin
- H9. A Cheesecake – approx. 20cm in diameter, presented on a plate
- H10. A Victoria Sponge Cake – **Please read RULE 19 carefully for recipe**
- H11. Five Cheese Scones
- H12. A Quiche – approx. 20cm in diameter, presented on a plate
- H13. An Apple Pie approx. 20cm in diameter, short crust pastry top and bottom, presented on a plate
- H14. Five Decorated Cup Cakes

SECTION W: BEVERAGES

- W1. A Bottle of Home Made Fruit/Vegetable/Flower Wine – 750 ml bottle, not from a kit

SECTION Y: HOBBYCRAFTS (Please read Rule 18)

- Y1. Any craft not on schedule (please specify on entry form)
- Y2. A Knitted Toy
- Y3. A Crochet Toy
- Y4. Cross stitch
- Y5. A Painting – own original work, A4 max size, unframed
- Y6. A Decorated Plant Pot 10cm-15cm diameter pot

SECTION C: CHILDREN'S CLASSES

- C1. Pre-school – My Favourite Flower
- C2. Under 12's – A Miniature Garden in a seed tray (approx. 6 x 8 inches)
- C3. Under 12's – A Greeting Card
- C4. Under 12's – A Decorated Plant Pot
- C5. Under 12's – A Vegetable/Fruit Creature
